# From The Mayor's Desk

April is upon us, and we have a busy month ahead. We are excited about the American Rescue Plan Open House that the Town is holding on April 7, 2022, at 6:00 PM. The purpose of the Open House is to get input from the residents on how you wish to see the Town spend the \$359,112.00 that we are receiving from the Federal Government. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for the Town, so please come out that evening and make your voice heard. I promise you that your Welaka Town Council wants to listen to your input, and it will be a significant part of our decision-making on how to spend the money.

We are also holding a Golf Cart Ordinance Workshop on April 14, 2022, at 5:30 PM at Welaka Town Hall to discuss our new Golf Cart Ordinance and to get your input. Let me set your mind at ease; the Welaka Town Council has no interest in getting rid of Golf Carts. We consider it part of what makes Welaka a great place to live. However, we are concerned about people driving on CR 309 and CR308 B as it's dangerous. This will be addressed in the Ordinance. I encourage you to please come out that night and ask questions and give us your input.

On an operational note, the staff at Welaka Town Hall recently spent 4 hours testing new software that will improve all aspects of your interaction with the Town. It will allow you to receive your water bills by email and a more flexible way to pay your account, via text or over the telephone. It includes a new accounting software that will allow us to keep a closer eye on how we spend your tax dollars and ensure we spend them wisely. It consists of a new online building permit section that will allow you to apply, pay for, and receive a building permit entirely online. You will also be able to check the status of an inspection and receive input from the building inspector/department about any concerns they may have. We anticipate this will dramatically reduce the time to get a building permit and streamline the entire process. We will be holding a workshop soon to allow you to preview the new software before we make any purchases.

On a Town events front, we are very excited about all the great event opportunities in the Town this month. They include Food Truck Friday, starting Friday, April 1 at 5:30 PM to 8:30 PM at Jefferson Smith Park by the Dollar General Store. There will be great food and live music all evening. There will be a designated parking area for golf carts and will help us to safely manage traffic. As parking is limited, I ask if you have a properly registered golf cart, to please consider driving it that evening. We are also excited about our first Jazz Under the Stars concert at Jefferson Smith Park on April 23, 2022, at 7:00 PM. We will be hosting "Sleek Bank," an amazing Jazz band. Food will also be available

that evening. Please come out and join us for these great events, and please let your Events Committee members know how much you appreciate their hard work in hosting these events.

Finally, I wanted to update you on some big projects we are doing in the Town. First, I have contacted Mittauer and Associates. They are a Civil Engineering Firm specializing in road engineering. I recently spoke to the Mayor of Interlachen, and he highly recommends them as they are the ones that did the engineering for their roads. My discussions with them included the start of the engineering process for paving our streets in Welaka. Before paving can occur, we need to have the engineering and specifications of the roads to present to the paving contractors for them to bid on. They say that "A journey of a thousand miles starts with the first step!" This is the first step. We are also getting ready to open the process for engineering bids for our new Wastewater Treatment Plant. As you have heard me say countless times, this new advanced Wastewater Treatment Plant will be a game-changer for the Town. The Town has also applied to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity for a job growth infrastructure grant for \$3.3 million dollars to help fully fund our new Wastewater Plant. I intend to ensure that the new Wastewater Treatment Plant is fully funded by grant and legislative appropriation dollars and not by our residents. I will keep you informed on our progress.

In closing, as I am sitting here writing this and asking you, the residents of Welaka, to please give us your input, it reminds me of Abraham Lincoln's statement from the Gettysburg Address. "That government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the Earth." This is one of the bedrock principles of our Nation; therefore, it is so critical that we hear from you, the residents of our Town. This is your government and can only function properly when you are a part of it. Part of your participation starts with casting your vote for whom you want to represent you. But it goes further because "government for the people" can only occur when the people let their elected officials know what they want. I realize that not all parts of the government in the United States necessarily invite this type of participation. Still, I can assure you that your Welaka Town Council certainly does and wants to hear from you. Until next month, I hope everyone enjoys Spring in Welaka and all its opportunities.

# **From The Council President**

April is here! We likely won't see cold weather until the end of the year, which is a good thing for most Floridians who enjoy the warm Florida weather. April is also Keep America Beautiful Month, which coincides perfectly with our next town-wide community clean-up, to be held on April 9<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 AM. At the end of last year, the local non-profit, Friends of Welaka, voted to hold these cleanup events on a quarterly, rather than annual, basis. The first clean-up this year was held on January 8<sup>th</sup> and over 30 volunteers showed up to help! Although Friends of Welaka, along with Keep Putnam Beautiful, sponsors this event, please know that you do not need to be a member to participate.

Here's how it works: At 8:00 AM, coffee and snacks will be available at the Town Hall Pavilion. Supplies, such as trash bags, grabbers, and gloves will be passed out. You will need to bring your own hat and sunscreen, and we recommend wearing closed-toe shoes. Next, we designate small groups with a Team Leader for each group. We'll then venture out into the neighborhoods by 9:00 AM. The Team Leaders will have a golf cart to carry water and additional supplies. They will be responsible for keeping track of each member in their group and covering the streets that they are assigned. In a few short hours, we will have covered each and every street in Welaka!
