As we move into the fall, it is a beautiful time in Welaka. We are starting to see an end to the rain and the hot temperatures. Our holiday celebrations are right around the corner, and the Welaka Events Committee has been working hard to make this holiday season one of the best Welaka has ever had. They have started planning for our Christmas Parade and festival, which will be on December 11, 2021. Our celebration this year is entitled "Christmas at the River" and will be filled with many more events than in past years. Our Christmas Parade will begin as usual at noon; however, after the parade, everyone is invited to Downtown Park for our first annual Arts and Crafts Festival. Starting at 1:00 PM that day, there will be live music in the park, food trucks, and Christmas Arts and Crafts vendors. The children will have the opportunity to see Santa and get their pictures taken. In the afternoon, there will Tree Lighting Ceremony, and to end the day of celebration a Boat Parade at the Welaka floating dock, which will begin at Acosta Creek Marina and end at River Bend. The goal this year is to make our Christmas Celebration a full day of events. The events committee is also working with Friends of Welaka and our local churches to host a Trick or Treat Party for the children on October 31, 2021, from 5:00 to 7:00 PM at Welaka Town Hall. There will be candy, music, food, and games. Everyone is encouraged to wear their costume (I'll be wearing mine) and join us for a spooktacular evening. Residents are encouraged to come out that afternoon, bring a bag of candy and be a part of giving our candy to the kids. A Moment in History

Florida was named for the day on which it was first seen (April 2, 1513) by Spanish explorer Ponce de Leon, who called it La Florida in honor of Pascua Florida, the Spanish Feast of the Flowers (Easter). Contrary to popular belief Ponce de Leon did not found St. Augustine. It was founded on September 8, 1565, by Spanish admiral Pedro Menéndez de Avilés, Florida's first governor. He named the settlement "San Agustín", as his ships bearing settlers, troops, and supplies from Spain had first sighted land in Florida eleven days earlier on August 28, the feast day of St. Augustine. The city served as the capital of Spanish Florida for over 200 years.
