# From The Mayor's Desk

We are entering the month of May, and Spring is in full bloom in Welaka. We are very excited about all the things happening here! The Town of Welaka just finished hosting two successful events. Our First Food Truck Friday was April 1st, and wow, was it a success! We had a fantastic DJ, 8 food trucks, and over 500 people attended the event! Our next Food Truck Friday will be on May 6th and we are excited about it as well. First, from a community standpoint, I have never seen an event in Welaka bring all areas of our community together as it did. We also noticed many residents from our neighboring communities, such as Pomona Park, Crescent City, Fruitland, Georgetown, and even Palatka. This tells me that South Putnam residents want events like this in their community, and Welaka is happy to host them. We did learn a few things from the event, including adding more food trucks to shorten lines, adding more picnic tables, and spraying the field for insects before our events. Public Works also opened a section in Jefferson Smith Park to allow easier access to our restrooms.

On April 23rd, we had our first jazz concert in Jefferson Smith Park. It was also a smashing hit! Our Events Committee worked hard on this event, and we appreciate them for all they do. I would also like to extend a special thanks to Sandra Walker for heading up our Jazz event. We are excited about having more live concerts in our parks in the future.

We are excited about all the Public Works department projects getting accomplished too! Everything from putting up the new lights in the Downtown and Jefferson Smith Parks to installing our new 8 pet waste stations as recommended by our Citizen's Advisory Board. My management style empowers people by allowing them to gather information and make decisions independently. Our new Public Works director, John Stuart, has taken to this very well and is doing an amazing job leading his crew. We are also adding some new equipment to the Public Works Department, such as a new Kubota Utility vehicle that was just received. This allows the Public Works crew to pick up trash quickly and safely on the sides of our streets before they mow. We will also be asking the Welaka Town Council to approve the purchase of a new Kubota Lawn Mower to aid in the maintenance of the Town. Some of our mowers are over 18 years old and starting to give us trouble. We have reached a point where they need to be retired, and new equipment cycled into our fleet.

We are also waiting for our Marine Contractor to start work on repairing the end of our floating dock. The end of the pier has been closed for some time, and I am ready to get it fixed and back open. I am pleased to say that I negotiated with our contractor to train our Public Works Director on how to do annual maintenance on the dock, which will save a significant amount of money in the future. Concerning Public Works, I kept the best part of my update to last. On April 12th, the Welaka Town Council unanimously approved a \$160,000 street repair project to help fix our crumbling roads. It will include using a special grader and road surfacer to break up the millings on our streets. We will

then add fresh millings and lime rock and recompact our streets. After which, a company will seal the streets to help extend their life. When I took office, I promised you that fixing our streets would be a priority, and this will go a long way in keeping my promise while I seek grants to pave our streets. There will be some temporary street closures in the coming weeks. I promise to keep them to a minimum and announce them on Facebook and our website www.welaka-fl.gov before they occur. I ask you to please be patient with us as we work our way through the Town fixing our streets.

On a Utility Front, I am delighted to announce that our Request for Qualifications (RFQs) has gone out for engineers for our new Wastewater Treatment Plant. As you read this, we are receiving responses from engineers interested in helping us with everything from our wastewater plant to our streets. I am also very excited to announce that the Town of Welaka will be seeking a Community Development Block Grant to install auto-read water meters throughout the Town. We are seeking an auto-read meter system because it will help us quickly locate water leaks, saving us time and conserving water while also protecting you from high water bills that come from leaks not being discovered until our next water meter reading. We are also seeking a grant to replace critical sewer service lines and rehab some of our essential lift stations. My promise is to leave Welaka in better shape than I found it, and I intend to keep that promise. I will keep you in the loop as we move forward. I am also excited to announce that Florida Rural Water has completed our Utility Condition Survey, and I expect to be able to release the report to the Town in June. Let me be clear, there are many issues in our utility system we need to address, but we can only do that when we have a clear picture of what we are dealing with. After the Utility Condition Survey is ready, I will be creating a five and ten-vear work plan to get our Water and Sewer System up to where it needs to be for the future. You will also notice a special reminder from our Utility Department NOT TO flush any wet-wipes down your toilet. There is a common misconception that they are biodegradable when in reality, they are not. We pull hundreds of pounds of wet-wipes out of our pumps and sewer system each month. This results in unnecessary repair and replacement of our equipment, resulting in you paying higher utility bills. I will give you an example; recently, we had lift station 6 go down on 4th Avenue. This resulted in us calling a septic company to pump out the lift station while removing all the wet-wipes (rags) from our pumps. The trouble is, that sewage does not stop flowing just because our pumps go down because people continue to flush their toilets and wash their clothes. We had to pay over \$2,000 for the pump truck to keep the station pumped down and the labor and parts we needed to get the station back online. The total cost of this incident was close to \$3,000, all because of wet-wipes being flushed down our sewer system. I ask you to please do your part in protecting our water and wastewater system by not flushing anything down the toilet. Remember, only flush the 3 P's: Pee, Poop, and Toilet Paper. Our system belongs to us all, and we are all responsible for protecting it.

We have entirely codified our Welaka Book of Codes on a governmental front, and I expect the Welaka Town Council will be adopting it either in the May or June Town Council Meetings. This new system will allow you to go online and search any Welaka Town Ordinance we have on the books, finding documents easily and quickly. We have also recently purchased a new device that will allow us to broadcast our meetings with better sound and picture quality, so look for that in our May meeting. We also recently hosted our American Rescue Plan Open House, and I am pleased to say we had an excellent turn-out of our residents and some great ideas on how you want us to spend the Town's grant money. On a government operational front, our Town Clerk and Utility Clerk also recently completed an evaluation of new accounting software that the Town is looking to purchase. The new software will

provide a better, more transparent accounting of your tax dollars. But it will also allow us to offer online building permit services and online code enforcement reporting in real-time, plus the ability to get a copy of your water bill emailed to you as soon as it is posted, along with a paper copy mailed if you so desire. It will also include the ability to make any payments online if you so choose, such as for an occupational license or golf cart sticker renewal. My goal is to make it easier for the residents of Welaka to interact with their government and simplify any process a Town resident needs to work through, such as applying for a building permit or renewing a golf cart sticker.

We will now move to the evaluation phase, which will include us visiting the City of Flagler Beach and the Clay County Utility Authority to see the software in action and get a clear picture if the software is right for us. I will keep you informed of our progress.

We will also be holding our new Golf Cart Ordinance Workshop in May. I apologize it has taken so long to get us to this point; our Town Attorney has worked long and hard to allow for side-by-sides in Welaka. I appreciate your patience.

I realize I covered a lot this month, and I am honestly glad I could because it speaks to all that we are working together to accomplish tasks in Welaka. It continues to be an honor and a privilege to serve as your Mayor. I hope everyone continues to enjoy Spring in Welaka, and I hope to see you at the next Food Truck Friday Event on May 6th. Have a great month, and I look forward to speaking to you again next month.


# Helping Hands of Welaka Toy Drive
